FIRST YEAR BACHELOR OF PHARMACY (B. Pharm.) COURSE – 2019 pattern (EFFECTIVE FROM ACADEMIC YEAR 2019-2020)







CHAPTER- I: REGULATIONS

- Short Title and Commencement These regulations shall be called as "The Revised Regulations for the B. Pharm. Degree Program (CBCS) of the Pharmacy Council of India, New Delhi". They shall come into effect from the Academic Year 2016-17. The regulations framed are subject to modifications from time to time by Pharmacy Council of India.
- 2. Minimum qualification for admission
 - First year B. Pharm: Candidate shall have passed 10+2 examination conducted by the respective state/central government authorities recognized as equivalent to 10+2 examination by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) with English as one of the subjects and Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics (P.C.M) and or Biology (P.C.B / P.C.M.B.) as optional subjects individually. Any other qualification approved by the Pharmacy Council of India as equivalent to any of the above examinations.
- 2.2. B. Pharm lateral entry (to third semester): A pass in D. Pharm. course from an institution approved by the Pharmacy Council of India under section 12 of the Pharmacy Act.
- 3. Duration of the program The course of study for B.Pharm shall extend over a period of eight semesters (four academic years) and six semesters (three academic years) for lateral entry students. The curricula and syllabi for the program shall be prescribed from time to time by Pharmacy Council of India, New Delhi.
- Medium of instruction and examinations Medium of instruction and examination shall be in English.
- 5. Working days in each semester Each semester shall consist of not less than 90 working days. The odd semesters shall be conducted from the month of June/July to November/December and the even semesters shall be conducted from December/January to May/June in every calendar year.
- 6. Attendance and progress A candidate is required to put in at least 80% attendance in individual courses considering theory and practical separately. The candidate shall complete the prescribed course satisfactorily to be eligible to appear for the respective examinations.
- 7. Program/Course credit structure As per the philosophy of Credit Based Semester System, certain quantum of academic work viz. theory classes, tutorial hours, practical classes per are measured in terms of credits. On satisfactory completion of the courses, a candidate earns credits.

2





The amount of credit associated with a course is dependent upon the number of hours of instruction per week in that course. Similarly, the credit associated with any of the other academic, co/extra-curricular activities is dependent upon the quantum of work expected to be put in for each of these activities per week.

Credit assignment

Theory and Laboratory courses Courses are broadly classified as Theory and Practical. Theory courses consist of lecture (L) and /or tutorial (T) hours, and Practical (P) courses consist of hours spent in the laboratory. Credits (C) for a course is dependent on the number of hours of instruction per week in that course, and is obtained by using a multiplier of one (1) for lecture and tutorial hours, and a multiplier of half (1/2) for practical (laboratory) hours. Thus, for example, a theory course having three lectures and one tutorial per week throughout the semester carries a credit of 4. Similarly, a practical having four laboratory hours per week throughout semester carries a credit of 2.

Minimum credit requirements The minimum credit points required for award of a B. Pharm. degree is 208. These credits are divided into Theory courses, Tutorials, Practical, Practice School and Project over the duration of eight semesters. The credits are distributed semester-wise as shown in Table IX. Courses generally progress in sequences, building competencies and their positioning indicates certain academic maturity on the part of the learners. Learners are expected to follow the semester-wise schedule of courses given in the syllabus. The lateral entry students shall get 52 credit points transferred from their D. Pharm program. Such students shall take up additional remedial courses of 'Communication Skills' (Theory and Practical) and 'Computer Applications in Pharmacy' (Theory and Practical) equivalent to 3 and 4 credit points respectively, a total of 7 credit points to attain 59 credit points, the maximum of I and II semesters.

- Academic work A regular record of attendance both in Theory and Practical shall be maintained by the teaching staff of respective courses.
- 9. Course of study The course of study for B. Pharm shall include Semester Wise Theory & Practical as given in Table I to VIII. The number of hours to be devoted to each theory, tutorial and practical course in any semester shall not be less than that shown in Table I to VIII.

1. Program Committee

- The B. Pharm. program shall have a Program Committee constituted by the Head of the institution in consultation with all the Heads of the departments.
- 2. The composition of the Program Committee shall be as follows:

A senior teacher shall be the Chairperson; One Teacher from each department handling B.Pharm courses; and four student representatives of the program (one from each academic year), nominated by the Head of the institution.

3. Duties of the Program Committee:

- i. Periodically reviewing the progress of the classes.
- Discussing the problems concerning curriculum, syllabus and the conduct of classes.
- Discussing with the course teachers on the nature and scope of assessment for the course and the same shall be announced to the students at the beginning of respective semesters.
- Communicating its recommendation to the Head of the institution on academic matters.
- v. The Program Committee shall meet at least thrice in a semester preferably at the end of each Sessionalexam (Internal Assessment) and before the end semester exam.

2. Examinations/Assessments

The scheme for internal assessment and end semester examinations is given in Table - X.

2.1. End semester examinations

The End Semester Examinations for each theory and practical coursethrough semesters I to VIII shall beconducted by the university except for the subjects with asterix symbol (*) in table I and II for which examinations shall be conducted by the subject experts at college level and the marks/grades shall be submitted to the university.

12 . Promotion and award of grades

A student shall be declared PASS and eligible for getting grade in a course of B.Pharm.program if he/she secures at least 50% marks in that particular course including internal assessment. For example, to be declared as PASS and to get grade, the student has to secure a minimum of 50 marks for the total of 100 including continuous mode of assessment and end semester theory examination and has to secure a minimum of 25 marks for the total 50 including internal assessment and end semester practical examination.

13. Carry forward of marks

In case a student fails to secure the minimum 50% in any Theory or Practical course as specified in 12, then he/she shall reappear for the end semester examination of that course. However his/her marks of the Internal Assessment shall be carried over and he/she shall be entitled for grade obtained by him/her on passing.

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14. Improvement of internal assessment

A student shall have the opportunity to improve his/her performance in the Sessional exam component of the internal assessment. The re-conduct of the Sessional exam shall be completed before the commencement of next end semester theory examinations.

15. Re-examination of end semester examinations

Reexamination ofend semester examinationshall be conducted as per the schedule given in table XIII. The exact dates of examinations shall be notified from time to time.

16. Academic Progression:

No student shall be admitted to any examination unless he/she fulfills the norms given in 6. Academic progression rules are applicable as follows:

A student shall be eligible to carry forward all the courses of I, II and III semesters till the IV semester examinations. However, he/she shall not be eligible to attend the courses of V semester until all the courses of I and II semesters are successfully completed.

A student shall be eligible to carry forward all the courses of III, IV and V semesters till the VI semester examinations. However, he/she shall not be eligible to attend the courses of VII semester until all the courses of I, II, III and IV semesters are successfully completed.

A student shall be eligible to carry forward all the courses of V, VI and VII semesters till the VIII semester examinations. However, he/she shall not be eligible to get the course completion certificate until all the courses of I, II, III, IV, V and VI semesters are successfully completed.

A student shall be eligible to get his/her CGPA upon successful completion of the courses of I to VIII semesters within the stipulated time period as per the norms specified in 26.

A lateral entry student shall be eligible to carry forward all the courses of III, IV and V semesters till the VI semester examinations. However, he/she shall not be eligible to attend the courses of VII semester until all the courses of III and IV semesters are successfully completed.

A lateral entry student shall be eligible to carry forward all the courses of V, VI and VII semesters till the VIII semester examinations. However, he/she shall not be eligible to get the course completion certificate until all the courses of III, IV, V and VI semesters are successfully completed.

A lateral entry student shall be eligible to get his/her CGPA upon successful completion of the courses of III to VIII semesters within the stipulated time period as per the north

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specified in 26.

Any student who has given more than 4 chances for successful completion of I / III semester courses and more than 3 chances for successful completion of II / IV semester courses shall be permitted to attend V / VII semester classes ONLY during the subsequent academic year as the case may be. In simpler terms there shall NOT be any ODD BATCH for any semester.

Note: Grade AB should be considered as failed and treated as one head for deciding academic progression. Such rules are also applicable for those students who fail to register for examination(s) of any course in any semester.

Rules for Carry Forward:

The curriculum (including regulations, structure and syllabi) is in force from academic year 2018-19 and onwards for First Year B. Pharm, for academic year 2019- 20 onwards for Second Year B. Pharm., for academic year 2020-21 and onwards for Third Year B. Pharm., and for academic year 2021-22 and onwards for Final Year B. Pharm.

The learners who were admitted to First Year B. Pharm. of 2015 pattern during the academic year 2017-18 or before & failed in the First Year B.Pharm. of 2015 pattern examination will have to take admission to Semester-III of Second Year B. Pharm. of

2018 pattern in academic year 2019-20 or onwards, provided that

- a) Their result of F. Y. B. Pharm of 2015 pattern is either pass or fails with A. T. K. T. The said students will have to take up additional remedial courses as follows.
- b) The learners who were admitted to S.Y B. Pharm. of 2015 pattern during the academic year 2018-19 or before and fail in the S.Y B.Pharm. of 2015 pattern examination will have to take admission to Semester-V of Third Year B. Pharm. of 2018 pattern in academic year 2020-21 or onwards, provided that Their result of S. Y. B. Pharm of 2015 pattern is either pass or fails with A. T. K. T. The said students will have to take up additional remedial course as follows.

A learner who remains absent for any end semester examination shall be assigned a letter grade of ABand a corresponding grade point of zero. He/she should reappear for the said evaluation/examination in due course.

18. The Semester grade point average (SGPA)

The performance of a student in a semester is indicated by a number call

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Grade Point Average' (SGPA). The SGPA is the weighted average of the grade points obtained in all the courses by the student during the semester. For example, if a student takes five courses(Theory/Practical) in a semester with credits C1, C2, C3, C4 and C5 and the student's grade points in these courses are G1, G2, G3, G4 and G5, respectively, and then students' SGPA is equal to:

$$SGPA = \frac{C_1G_1 + C_2G_2 + C_3G_3 + C_4G_4 + C_5G_5}{C1 + C2 + C3 + C4 + C5}$$

The SGPA is calculated to two decimal points. It should be noted that, the SGPA for any semester shall take into consideration the F and ABS grade awarded in that semester. For example if a learner has a F or ABS grade in course 4, the SGPA shall then be computed as:

$$SGPA = \frac{C1G1 + C2G2 + C3G3 + C4* ZERO + C5G5}{C1 + C2 + C3 + C4 + C5}$$

19. Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)

The CGPA is calculated with the SGPA of all the VIII semesters to two decimal points and is indicated in final grade report card/final transcript showing the grades of all VIII semesters and their courses. The CGPA shall reflect the failed statusin case of F grade(s),till the course(s) is/are passed. When the course(s)is/are passedby obtaining a pass grade on subsequent examination(s) the CGPA shall only reflect the new grade and not the fail grades earned earlier. The CGPA is calculated as:

$$CGPA = \frac{C1S1 + C2S2 + C3S3 + C4S4 + C5S5 + C6S6 + C7S7 + C8S8}{C1 + C2 + C3 + C4 + C5 + C6 + C7 + C8}$$

where C_1 , C_2 , C_3 , _ is the total number of credits for semester I,II,III,.... and S_1 , S_2 , S_3 , _ is the SGPA of semester I,II,III,....



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20. Declaration of class

The class shall be awarded on the basis of CGPA as follows

First Class with Distinction	= CGPA of. 7.50 and above
First Class	= CGPA of. 6.00 to 7.49
Second Class	= CGPA of. 5.00 to 5.99

21. Project work

All the students shall undertake a project under the supervision of a teacher and submit a report. The area of the project shall directly relate any one of the elective subject opted by the student in semester VIII. The project shall be carried out in group not exceeding 5 in number. The project report shall be submitted in triplicate (typed & bound copy not less than 25 pages).

The internal and external examiner appointed by the University shall evaluate the project at the time of the Practical examinations of other semester(s). Students shall be evaluated in groups for four hours (i.e., about half an hour for a group of five students). The projects shall be evaluated as per the criteria given below

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Explanation: The 75 marks assigned to the dissertation book shall be same for all the students in a group. However, the 75 marks assigned for presentation shall be awarded based on the performance of individual students in the given criteria.





22. Industrial training (Desirable)

Every candidate shall be required to work for at least 150 hours spread over four weeks in a Pharmaceutical Industry/Hospital. It includes Production unit, Quality Control department, Quality Assurance department, Analytical laboratory, manufacturing unit, Pharmaceutical R&D, Hospital (Clinical Pharmacy), Clinical Research Organization, Community Pharmacy, etc. After the Semester - VI and before the commencement of Semester - VII, and shall submit satisfactory report of such work and certificate duly signed by the authority of training organization to the head of the institute.

AND/OR

Every candidate shall be required to undergo any one of the Skill development modules mentioned below(Duration - Min. 04 weeks)

- a) Hands on Training (Central instrumentation lab/Machine room etc)
- b) UGC/AICTE recognized online courses (SWAYAM/NPTEL etc)

After the successful completion of the module the candidate shall submit satisfactory report and certificate duly signed by the authority of training organization/Head of the institute

23. Practice School

In the VII semester, every candidate shall undergo practice school for a period of 150 hours evenly distributed throughout the semester. The student shall opt any one of the domains for practice school declared by the program committee from time to time.

At the end of the practice school, every student shall submit a printed report (in triplicate) on the practice school he/she attended (not more than 25 pages). Along with the exams of semester VII, the report submitted by the student, knowledge and skills acquired by the student through practice school shall be evaluated by the subject experts at college level and grade point shall be awarded.

Award of Ranks

Ranks and Medals shall be awarded on the basis of final CGPA. However, candidates who fail in one or more courses during the B.Pharm program shall not be eligible for award of ranks. Moreover, the candidates should have completed the B. Pharm program in minimum prescribed number of years, (four years) for the award of Ranks.

Award of degree

Candidates who fulfill the requirements mentioned above shall be engible for award of degree during the ensuing convocation.

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26. Duration for completion of the program of study

The duration for the completion of the program shall be fixed as double the actual duration of the program and the students have to pass within the said period, otherwise they have to get fresh Registration.

27. Re-admission after break of study

Candidate who seeks re-admission to the program after break of study has to get the approval from the university by paying a condonation fee.

No condonation is allowed for the candidate who has more than 2 years of break up period and he/she has to rejoin the program by paying the required fees.

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CHAPTER - I: REGULATIONS

1. Short Title and Commencement

These regulations shall be called as "The Revised Regulations for the Master of Pharmacy (M. Pharm.)Degree Program – Credit Based Semester System (CBSS) of the Pharmacy Council of India, New Delhi". They shall come into effect from the Academic Year 2016–17. The regulations framed are subject to modifications from time to time by the authorities of theuniversity.

2. Minimum qualification for admission

- A. Pass in the following examinations -
- a) Pharm Degree examination of an Indian university established by law in India from an institution approved by Pharmacy Council of India and has scored not less than 55 % of the maximum marks (aggregate of 4 years of B.Pharm.)
- b) Every student, selected for admission to post graduate pharmacy program in any PCI approved institution should have obtained registration with the State Pharmacy Council or should obtain the same within one month from the date of his/her admission, failing which the admission of the candidate shall be cancelled.

Note: It is mandatory to submit a migration certificate obtained from the respective university where the candidate had passed his/her qualifying degree (B.Pharm.)

Duration of the program

The program of study for M.Pharm, shall extend over a period of four semesters (two academic years). The curricula and syllabi for the program shall be prescribed from time to time by Phamacy Council of India, New Delhi.

4. Medium of instruction and examinations

Medium of instruction and examination shall be in English.

5. Working days in each semester

Each semester shall consist of not less than 100 working days. The odd semesters shall be conducted from the month of June/July to November/December and the even semesters shall be conducted from the month of December/January to May/June in every calendar year.

6. Attendance and progress

A candidate is required to put in at least 80% attendance in individual courses considering theory and practical separately. The candidate shall complete the prescribed course satisfactorily to be eligible to appear for the respective examinations.

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7. Program / Course credit structure

As per the philosophy of Credit Based Semester System, certain quantum of academic work viz. theory classes, practical classes, seminars, assignments, etc. are measured in terms of credits. On satisfactory completion of the courses, a candidate earns credits. The amount of credit associated with a course is dependent upon the number of hours of instruction per week in that course. Similarly the credit associated with any of the other academic, co/extra— curricular activities is dependent upon the quantum of work expected to be put in for each of these activities per week / per activity.

7.1 Credit assignment

Theory and Laboratory courses

Courses are broadly classified as Theory and Practical. Theory courses consist of lecture (L) and Practical (P) courses consist of hours spent in the laboratory. Credits (C) for a course is dependent on the number of hours of instruction per week in that course, and is obtained by using a multiplier of one (1) for lecture and a multiplier of half (1/2) for practical (laboratory) hours. Thus, for example, a theory course having four lectures per week throughout the semester carries a credit of 4. Similarly, a practical having four laboratory hours per week throughout semester carries a credit of 2.

The contact hours of seminars, assignments and research work shall be treated as that of practical courses for the purpose of calculating credits. i.e., the contact hours shall be multiplied by 1/2. Similarly, the contact hours of journal club, research work presentations and discussions with the supervisor shall be considered as theory course and multiplied by 1.

Minimum credit requirements

The minimum credit points required for the award of M. Pharm. degree is 95. However based on the credit points earned by the students under the head of co-curricular activities, a student shall earn a maximum of 100 credit points. These credits are divided into Theory courses, Practical, Seminars, Assignments, Research work, Discussions with the supervisor, Journal club and Co-Curricular activities over the duration of four semesters. The credits are distributed semester-wise as shown in Table 14. Courses generally progress in sequence, building competencies and their positioning indicates certain academic maturity on the part of the learners. Learners are expected to follow the semester-wise schedule of courses given in the syllabus.

8. Academic work

A regular record of attendance both in Theory, Practical, Seminar and Assignment and Journal club, Discussion with the supervisor, Research work presentation and Dissertation shall be maintained by the department / teaching staff of respective courses.

9. Course of study

The specializations in M.Pharm program is given in Table 1.

10. Program Committee

- The M. Pharm. programme shall have a Programme Committee constituted by the Head of the institution in consultation with all the Heads of the departments.
- The composition of the Programme Committee shall be asfollows: A teacher at the cadre of Professor shall be the Chairperson; One Teacher from eachM.Pharm specialization and four student representatives (two from each academic year), nominated by the Head of the institution.
- 3. Duties of the Programme Committee:
 - i. Periodically reviewing the progress of the classes.
 - Discussing the problems concerning curriculum, syllabus and the conduct of classes.
 - iii. Discussing with the course teachers on the nature and scope of assessment for the course and the same shall be announced to the students at the beginning of respective semesters.
 - Communicating its recommendation to the Head of the institution on academic matters.
 - v. The Programme Committee shall meet at least twice in a semester preferably at the end of each sessional exam and routine the end semester exam.

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^{*}The credit points assigned for extracurricular and or co-curricular activities shall be given by the Principals of the colleges and the same shall be submitted to the University. The criteria to acquire this credit point shall be defined by the colleges from time to time.

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12. Promotion and award of grades

14. Improvement of internal assessment

A student shall have the opportunity to improve his/her performance in each semester sessional exam component of the internal assessment. The re-conduct of the sessional exam shall be completed before the commencement of end semester theory examinations.

15. Re examination of end semester examinations

Re examination of end semester examination shall be conducted as per the schedule given in table 29. The exact dates of examinations shall be notified from time to time.

16. Allowed to keep terms (ATKT):

No student shall be admitted to any examination unless he/she fulfills the norms given in 6. ATKT rules are applicable as follows:

A student shall be eligible to carry forward all the courses of I and II semesters till the III semester examinations. However, he/she shall not be eligible to attend the courses of IV semester until all the courses of I, II and III semesters are successfully completed.

A student shall be eligible to get his/her CGPA upon successful completion of the courses of I to IV semesters within the stipulated time period as per the norms.

Note: Grade AB should be considered as failed and treated as one head for deciding ATKT. Such rules are also applicable for those students who fail to register for examination(s) of any course in any semester.

17. Grading of performances

Letter grades and grade pointsallocations:

Based on the performances, each student shall be awarded a final letter grade at the end of the semester for each course. The letter grades and their corresponding grade points are given in Table - 30.

A learner who remains absent for any end semester examination shall be assigned a letter grade of AB and a corresponding grade point of zero. He/she should reappear for the said evaluation/examination in due course.

18. The Semester grade point average (SGPA)

The performance of a student in a semester is indicated by a number called "Semester Grade Point Average' (SGPA). The SGPA is the weighted average of the grade points obtained in all the courses by the student during the semester.

For example, if a student takes five courses (Theory/Practical) in a semester with credits C1, C2, C3 and C4 and the student's grade points in these courses are G1, G2, G3 and G4, respectively, and then students' SGPA is equal to:

$$SGPA = \frac{C_1G_1 + C_2G_2 + C_3G_3 + C_4G_4}{C_1 + C_2 + C_3 + C_4}$$

The SGPA is calculated to two decimal points. It should be noted that, the SGPA for any semester shall take into consideration the F and ABS grade awarded in that semester. For example if a learner has a F or ABS grade in course 4, theSGPA shall then be computed as:

$$C_1G_1 + C_2G_2 + C_3G_3 + C_4$$

19. Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)

The CGPA is calculated with the SGPA of all the IV semesters to two decimal points and is indicated in final grade report card/final transcript showing the grades of all IV semesters and their courses. The CGPA shall reflect the failed status in case of F grade(s), till the course(s) is/are passed. When the course(s) is/are passed by obtaining a pass grade on subsequent examination(s) the CGPA shall only reflect the new grade and not the fail grades earned earlier. The CGPA is calculated as:

20. Declaration of class

The class shall be awarded on the basis of CGPA as follows:

21. Project work

All the students shall undertake a project under the supervision of a teacher in Semester III to IV and submit a report. 4 copies of the project report shall be submitted (typed & bound copy not less than 75 pages). The internal and external exainer appointed by the University shall evaluate the project at the time of the Practical examinations of other semester(s). The projects shall be evaluated as per the criteria given below.

22. Award of Ranks

Ranks and Medals shall be awarded on the basis of final CGPA. However, candidates who fail in one or more courses during the M.Pharm program shall not be eligible for award of ranks. Moreover, the candidates should have completed the M. Pharm program in minimum prescribed number of years, (two years) for the award of Ranks.

23. Award of degree

Candidates who fulfill the requirements mentioned above shall be eligible for award of degree during the ensuing convocation.

24. Duration for completion of the program of study

The duration for the completion of the program shall be fixed as double the actual duration of the program and the students have to pass within the said period, otherwise they have to get fresh Registration.

25. Revaluation and retotaling of answer papers







There is provision for re-totaling and revaluation of the answer papers in any examination. The candidates can apply for revaluation/ re-totaling by paying prescribed fee.

26. Re-admission after break of study

Candidate who seeks re-admission to the program after break of study has to get the approval from the university by paying a condonation fee.

Pharm.D. Regulations 2008

Regulations framed under section 10 of the Pharmacy Act, 1948 (8 of 1948).

(As approved by the Government of India, Ministry of Health vide, letter No.V.13013/1/2007-PMS, dated the 13th March, 2008 and notified by the Pharmacy Council of India).

No.14-126/2007-PCI.— In exercise of the powers conferred by section 10 of the Pharmacy Act, 1948 (8 of 1948), the Pharmacy Council of India, with the approval of the Central Government, hereby makes the following regulations, namely:-

CHAPTER-I

- Short title and commencement. (1) These regulations may be called the Pharm.D. Regulations 2008.
 - (2) They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the official Gazette.
- Pharm.D. shall consist of a certificate, having passed the course of study and examination as prescribed in these regulations, for the purpose of registration as a pharmacist to practice the profession under the Pharmacy Act, 1948.

CHAPTER-II

- 3. Duration of the course.
 - a) Pharm.D: The duration of the course shall be six academic years (five years of study and one year of internship or residency) full time with each academic year spread over a period of not less than two hundred working days. The period of six years duration is divided into two phases —
 - Phase I consisting of First, Second, Third, Fourth and Fifth academic year.

 Phase II consisting of internship or residency training during sixth year involving posting in speciality units. It is a short of training during sixth year

involving posting in speciality units. It is a phase of training wherein a student is exposed to actual pharmacy practice or clinical pharmacy services and acquires skill under supervision so that he or she may become capable of functioning independently.

b) Pharm.D. (Post Baccalaureate): The duration of the course shall be for three academic years (two years of study and one year internship or residency) full time with each academic year spread over a period of not less than two hundred working days. The period of three years duration is divided into two phases —

Phase I - consisting of First and Second academic year.

- Phase II consisting of Internship or residency training during third year involving posting in speciality units. It is a phase of training wherein a student is exposed to actual pharmacy practice or clinical pharmacy services, and acquires skill under supervision so that he or she may become capable of functioning independently.
- 4. Minimum qualification for admission to. -
- a) Pharm.D. Part-I Course A pass in any of the following examinations -
- (1) 10+2 examination with Physics and Chemistry as compulsory subjects along with one of the following subjects:

Mathematics or Biology.

- (2) A pass in D.Pharm course from an institution approved by the Pharmacy Council of India under section 12 of the Pharmacy Act.
- (3) Any other qualification approved by the Pharmacy Council of India as equivalent to any of the above examinations.

Provided that a student should complete the age of 17 years on or before 31st December of the year of admission to the course.

Provided that there shall be reservation of seats for the students belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and other Backward Classes in accordance with the instructions issued by the Central Government/State Government/Union Territory Administration as the case may be from time to time.

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b) Pharm.D. (Post Baccalaureate) Course -

A pass in B.Pharm from an institution approved by the Pharmacy Council of India under section 12 of the Pharmacy Act:

Provided that there shall be reservation of seats for the students belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and other Backward Classes in accordance with the instructions issued by the Central Government/State Government/Union Territory Administration as the case may be from time to time.

- Number of admissions in the above said programmes shall be as prescribed by the Pharmacy Council of India from time to time and presently be restricted as below
 - i) Pharm.D. Programme 30 students.
 - ii) Pharm.D. (Post Baccalaureate) Programme 10 students.
- Institutions running B.Pharm programme approved under section 12 of the Pharmacy Act, will only be permitted to run Pharm.D. programme. Pharm.D. (Post Baccalaureate) programme will be permitted only in those institutions which are permitted to run Pharm.D. programme.
- Course of study. The course of study for Pharm.D. shall include the subjects as
 given in the Tables below. The number of hours in a week, devoted to each subject
 for its teaching in theory, practical and tutorial shall not be less than that noted against
 it in columns (3), (4) and (5) below.

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Sixth Year:

Internship or residency training including postings in speciality units. Student should independently provide the clinical pharmacy services to the allotted wards.

- (i) Six months in General Medicine department, and
- (ii) Two months each in three other speciality departments
- Syllabus. The syllabus for each subject of study in the said Tables shall be as specified in Appendix -A to these regulations.
- Approval of the authority conducting the course of study. -(1) No person, institution, society or university shall start and conduct Pharm.D or Pharm.D. (Post Baccalaureate) programme without the prior approval of the Pharmacy Council of India.
 - (2) Any person or pharmacy college for the purpose of obtaining permission under sub-section (1) of section 12 of the Pharmacy Act, shall submit a scheme as prescribed by the Pharmacy Council of India.
 - (3) The scheme referred to in sub-regulation (2) above, shall be in such form and contain such particulars and be preferred in such manner and be accompanied with such fee as may be prescribed:

Provided that the Pharmacy Council of India shall not approve any institution under these regulations unless it provides adequate arrangements for teaching in regard to building, accommodation, labs., equipments, teaching staff, non-teaching staff, etc., as specified in Appendix-B to these regulations.

- Examination. (1) Every year there shall be an examination to examine the students.
 - (2) Each examination may be held twice every year. The first examination in a year shall be the annual examination and the second examination shall be supplementary examination.
 - (3) The examinations shall be of written and practical (including oral nature) carrying maximum marks for each part of a subject as indicated in Tables below:

- 11. Eligibility for appearing Examination .- Only such students who produce certificate from the Head of the Institution in which he or she has undergone the Pharm.D. or as the case may be, the Pharm.D. (Post Baccalaureate) course, in proof of his or her having regularly and satisfactorily undergone the course of study by attending not less than 80% of the classes held both in theory and in practical separately in each subject shall be eligible for appearing at examination.
- 12. Mode of examinations.— (1) Theory examination shall be of three hours and practical examination shall be of four hours duration.
 - A Student who fails in theory or practical examination of a subject shall reappearboth in theory and practical of the same subject.
 - (3) Practical examination shall also consist of a viva -voce (Oral) examination.
 - (4) Clerkship examination Oral examination shall be conducted after the completion of clerkship of students. An external and an internal examiner will evaluate the student. Students may be asked to present the allotted medical cases followed by discussion. Students' capabilities in delivering clinical pharmacy services, pharmaceutical care planning and knowledge of therapeutics shall be assessed.
- 13. Award of sessional marks and maintenance of records.— (1) A regular record of both theory and practical class work and examinations conducted in an institution imparting training for Pharm.D. or as the case may be, Pharm.D. (Post Baccalaureate) course, shall be maintained for each student in the institution and 30 marks for each theory and 30 marks for each practical subject shall be allotted as sessional.
 - (2) There shall be at least two periodic sessional examinations during each academic year and the highest aggregate of any two performances shall form the basis of calculating sessional marks.
 - (3) The sessional marks in practicals shall be allotted on the following basis:-

(i) Actual performance in the sessional examination

(20 marks);

(ii) Days day assessment in the practical class work, viga voce record maintenance, etc.

- 14. Minimum marks for passing examination.— A student shall not be declared to have passed examination unless he or she secures at least 50% marks in each of the subjects separately in the theory examinations, including sessional marks and at least 50% marks in each of the practical examinations including sessional marks. The students securing 60% marks or above in aggregate in all subjects in a single attempt at the Pharm.D. or as the case may be, Pharm. D. (Post Baccalaureate) course examination shall be declared to have passed in first class. Students securing 75% marks or above in any subject or subjects shall be declared to have passed with distinction in the subject or those subjects provided he or she passes in all the subjects in a single attempt.
- 15. Eligibility for promotion to next year.— All students who have appeared for all the subjects and passed the first year annual examination are eligible for promotion to the second year and, so on. However, failure in more than two subjects shall debar him or her from promotion to the next year classes.
- 16. Internship.— (1) Internship is a phase of training wherein a student is expected to conduct actual practice of pharmacy and health care and acquires skills under the supervision so that he or she may become capable of functioning independently.
 - (2) Every student has to undergo one year internship as per Appendix-C to these regulations.
- 17. Approval of examinations.— Examinations mentioned in regulations 10 to12 and 14 shall be held by the examining authority hereinafter referred to as the university, which shall be approved by the Pharmacy Council of India under sub-section (2) of section 12 of the Pharmacy Act, 1948. Such approval shall be granted only if the examining authority concerned fulfills the conditions as specified in Appendix-D to these regulations.
- 18, Certificate of passing examination.— Every student who has passed the examinations for the Pharm.D. (Doctor of Pharmacy) or Pharm.D. (Post Baccalaureate) (Doctor of Pharmacy) as the case may be, shall be granted a certificate by the examining authority.

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CHAPTER-III Practical training

- 19. Hospital posting.— Every student shall be posted in constituent hospital for a period of not less than fifty hours to be covered in not less than 200 working days in each of second, third & fourth year course. Each student shall submit report duly certified by the preceptor and duly attested by the Head of the Department or Institution as prescribed. In the fifth year, every student shall spend half a day in the morning hours attending ward rounds on daily basis as a part of clerkship. Theory teaching may be scheduled in the afternoon.
- 20. Project work.— (1) To allow the student to develop data collection and reporting skills in the area of community, hospital and clinical pharmacy, a project work shall be carried out under the supervision of a teacher. The project topic must be approved by the Head of the Department or Head of the Institution. The same shall be announced to students within one month of commencement of the fifth year classes. Project work shall be presented in a written report and as a seminar at the end of the year. External and the internal examiners shall do the assessment of the project work.
 - (2) Project work shall comprise of objectives of the work, methodology, results, discussions and conclusions.
- 21. Objectives of project work. The main objectives of the project work is to-
 - show the evidence of having made accurate description of published work of others and of having recorded the findings in an impartial manner; and
 - (ii) develop the students in data collection, analysis and reporting and interpretation skills.
- Methodology.— To complete the project work following methodology shall be adopted, namely:—
 - students shall work in groups of not less than two and not more than four under an authorised teacher;
 - (ii) project topic shall be approved by the Head of the Department or Head of the Institution;
 - (iii)project work chosen shall be related to the pharmacy practice in community, hospital and clinical setup. It shall be patient and treatment (Medicine) oriented, like drug utilisation reviews, pharmacoepidemiology, pharmacovigilance or pharmacoeconomics;
 - (iv) project work shall be approved by the institutional ethics committee;
 - (v) student shall present at least three seminars, one in the beginning, one at middle and one at the end of the project work; and
 - (vi)two-page write-up of the project indicating title, objectives, methodology anticipated benefits and references shall be submitted to the Head of the Department of Project indicating title, objectives, methodology

- 23. Reporting .— (1) Student working on the project shall submit jointly to the Head of the Department or Head of the Institution a project report of about 40-50 pages. Project report should include a certificate issued by the authorised teacher, Head of the Department as well as by the Head of the Institution
 - (2) Project report shall be computer typed in double space using Times Roman font on A4 paper. The title shall be in bold with font size 18, sub-tiles in bold with font size 14 and the text with font size 12. The cover page of the project report shall contain details about the name of the student and the name of the authorised teacher with font size 14.
 - (3) Submission of the project report shall be done at least one month prior to the commencement of annual or supplementary examination.
- Evaluation.— The following methodology shall be adopted for evaluating the project work—
 - (i) Project work shall be evaluated by internal and external examiners.
 - (ii) Students shall be evaluated in groups for four hours (i.e., about half an hour for a group of four students).
 - (iii)Three seminars presented by students shall be evaluated for twenty marks each and the average of best two shall be forwarded to the university with marks of other subjects.










- 5. Modern Cultural Day 7th May 2022

Introduction

The establishment of student councils plays an integral and important role in the student community. Student councils provide a typical structure through which students can discuss issues of concern and thereby undertake initiatives of benefit to the college and the wider public community.

Students have a voice and a contribution to make to their college. They must be allowed to express their views on issues of concern to them in the college. It is equally important that they are listened to and encouraged to take an active part in promoting the aims and objectives of the college.

The guidelines mentioned in this manual are purposed to provide practical guidance to student council members in the establishment and operation of the student council.

What is a Student Council?

A Student Council is a symbolic structure through which students in the college can become involved in college affairs, work in partnership with the Faculty, and students for the benefit of the college and its students.

Why have a Student Council?

The Student Council is a progressively common feature in many colleges and has worked to the benefit of the institutes. Students have a valuable contribution to make to the betterment of their college and their involvement in the operation of the college is a valuable part of the education process for the students. A Student Council provides an opportunity for students to engage in a structured partnership with students, and faculty in the operation of their college. Student Councils can create a sense of ownership of the college and its activities among the student population. The establishment of a Student Council allows students to acquire the sort of communication, planning, and organizational skills which will be of benefit to them in their future lives. It enables students to take responsibility for projects and to demonstrate that they can manage and bring such projects to a successful conclusion. College policies are much more likely to be successful when they are clearly under the concept successful when the concept successful when the concept successful when the concept successful when the concept suc





The Role of the Student Council

A Student Council will set its objectives. Some general objectives could include:

- · To enhance communication between students, and the faculty
- . To promote an environment favourable to educational and personal development
- To promote friendship and respect among the learners
- To support the Faculty and staff in the development of the college.
- . To represent the views of the students on matters of general concern to them

A Student Council will identify activities that it would like to be involved in organizing, although the final decision on the activities of a Student Council should be agreed with the college faculty. A Student Council should not through its activities interfere with or belittle from, the authority of the college faculty or the teaching staff of the college. It is therefore not a function of a Student Council to discuss or comment on matters relating to the employment or professional affairs of the Principal, teachers, and other staff of the college, or to become involved in any issues that fall within their professional competence.

The Student Council and the Principal

The role of the Principal is of central importance in the establishment and operation of a Student Council, assisting in the development of college policy, and in working with teachers and implementing it at the day to-day level, the Principal is centrally placed in all aspects of the college's operations.

In the beginning, the Principal, together with the other teachers, will assist in the development of a Student Council in several ways, for example, by discussing with students the role of a Student Council and the role of individual representatives on the Council and by advising on an appropriate constitution or statement of objectives. As the Council develops and begins to expand its role, the Principal will assist in guiding the Council's development, to allow for a constructive and purposeful Council.

The Student Council and Teachers

The Student Council can play an important role in recognizing and supporting the work of teachers. Similarly, the interest and support of teachers will be of great value to a Student Council, particularly during the early stages of its development. It is generally destrable for a member of the teaching staff to a constant times of the Council, as a principal will up good working habitat.





Key functions of Student Council

The functions and activities of a Student Council should support the aims and objectives of the Council and promote the development of the college and the welfare of its students, in planning and undertaking activities during the college year, the Council should:

- · Work closely with the Faculty, and students.
- . Consult regularly with students in the college, and
- Involve as many students as possible in the activities of the Council.

There is a wide range of activities of benefit to the college community which a Student Council may wish to undertake, some of which are outlined below:

1. Supporting the educational development and progress of students

The Student Council can contribute to the learning environment for students in the college by, for example, setting up study groups for students in exam classes or journal clubs, or group discussions on current affairs.

2. Representing the views of the student body to the college faculty

It involves talking and listening to the student body, considering their views and concerns, and discussing these with the college faculty on behalf of the students.

3. Assisting with induction and/or mentoring for new first-year students

Starting college life is a challenging and new experience for 1st Year students. During the mentoring program, senior students can help new students to find their feet and can help in their integration into the college community.

4. Promoting good communications within the college

Improving communication within the college community is a shared responsibility and a Student Council can contribute to this process. Organizing a regular newsletter, making presentations for staff meetings, mentioning updates about the college on the notice board

5. Contributing to the development of college policy

The Student Council can actively contribute to the development of college policy in a wide range of areas such as bullying, uniform requirements, behaviour code, and extra-curricular activities. The Council areas activities to consider individual policy in a N. A.

6. Assisting with or organizing fund-raising events for charity

Student Councils can organize events both within the college and involving the wider community, to raise money for designated charities.

7. Assisting in college sporting and cultural activities

Student Councils can assist in organizing and developing sports and cultural activities within the college, including, for example, sports days and drama or musical events.

8. Bridging with Student Councils in other colleges

It may be useful for a Student Council to bridge with Student Councils in other colleges, particularly in the organization of sporting and cultural activities and when fund-raising for charity. An existing Student Council could have a useful role in helping and advising a newly formed Student Council in another college. This bridging would help make good contacts in different colleges, which might be a useful professional strategy.

Guidelines for establishment and dissolution of Student Councils

The college after consultation with teachers draw up rules for the establishment of a Student Council, having regard to the following basic principles:

- The Student Council shall promote the interests of the college and the involvement of students in the affairs of the college, in co-operation with the college and teachers
- The Council should, as far as is practicable, he representative of the student community
- The college shall at all times retain the right to dissolve a Council or remove a Council member under these guidelines.

While establishing a student council, the college should provide a copy of the rules drawn up following these guidelines.

Size and Composition of a Student Council

The size and composition of a Student Council shall be determined by the college having regard both to the need for the Council to be representative of all students in the college and the need for it to function effectively. It may not always be appropriate for each class to have a representative on the Council. Appropriate gender balance on the Council is give Faculty Coordinator of Student's Council will assign the role/designation to the selected member on the basis of interview. Coordinator may change the role designation of any

Principal council member during the his/her tenure if needed.







First Meeting

The Principal or Faculty Coordinator of Student's Council should convene the first meeting of each newly formed Council.

Dissolution of a Student Council

Normally a Student Council shall be dissolved when the term of office of the members expires, faculty may dissolve the Student Council before the expiry of its term by the rules and procedures governing dissolution. When faculty intends to dissolve the Council, it will give the Council adequate notice and the reasons for the same.

Where the Student Council is dissolved another Council may be formed following the procedures outlined earlier. The council can be dissolved 8 to 10 weeks before the end of the academic year. Circumstances that may require the early dissolution of a Student Council include:

- · Where serious irregularities have occurred in the functioning of the Council
- Where a significant number of members of the Council have been involved in a serious breach of the college's code of behaviour
- Where the activities of the Council have jeopardized the welfare of staff or students of the college
- · Where serious financial irregularities have occurred

It will not be appropriate to dissolve a Council where only a few of its members have been involved in a breach of the college. In those circumstances, the college should only consider the removal of those students concerned.

Removing a member or members of the Council

Sometimes it may be more appropriate to remove an individual member (or members) of the Council rather than dissolve the Council as a whole. This may happen in two ways:

Removing a member can be considered if:

- A member fails to attend more than 3 meetings. The meetings include a whole council meeting and separate cell meetings as well.
- . There is a lack of commitment to the duties of the council member.
- · Member's causes a breach in any activity or program conducted by the council

The decision of removing a member should be taken on a majority vote of the vouncithe member should be given adequate notice of the proposal, the reasons, the opportunity to present his/her case.

The Principal or Faculty Coordinator of Student's Council may remove a member of the Council for above mentioned reason.

Suspension or demotion or a member or members of the Council

The Principal or Faculty Coordinator of Student's Council may suspend or demote a member of the Council for above mentioned reason.

Filling a vacancy on the Council

here a member is removed or resigns from office, the resulting vacancy should be filled under the procedures.

Getting started

When students wish to start a Council in their college, they should approach the Principal and ask for a copy of the rules for the establishment of a Student Council. Students should pay careful attention to the rules they are given and should not hesitate to ask the authority if they don't understand some part of the rules or need advice in general.

The work of the Student Council

The Student Council as a whole has responsibility for:

- Working with the faculty, and fellow students
- · Communicating and consulting with all of the students in the college
- · Involving as many students as possible in the activities of the Council
- · Planning and managing the Council's program of activities for the year
- · Managing and accounting for any funds raised by the Council

Planning and Managing the Work

While the Student Council members all have a part to play in the activities of the Council, not all can or need to be involved in organizing the work. It is for this reason that the Council should appoint officers. It may also decide to establish subcommittees.

Subcommittees

Rather than trying to plan and organize every activity during the year, a Student Council may find that it is more effective to use subcommittees working under a cell to plan and oversee specific Council activities. Subcommittees should be required to submit their plan to the Council for approval and should report back to the Council on their activities. One area where a subcommittee might be useful is a fundraising subcommittee. It is a matter for the Council to decide how many members of the Council will sit on a subcommittee and the Council may choose to dissolve a subcommittee at any time.

The role of the Officers

President:

The President is responsible for presiding over meetings of the Council. The President, with the secretary, prepares the agenda for each meeting and, where necessary, signs the minutes once they have been agreed by the Council. The President may also designate to represent the Council at meetings with Faculty.

Secretary:

The Secretary, with the President, prepares the agenda for each meeting and the Secretary then circulates it to all the members of the Council either in advance of the meeting or at the start of the meeting. This will involve consulting with the other Council officers to decide what will be included on the agenda. All agendas should include a provision for 'Any other business'; this allows Council members to raise a matter for discussion if Cohas not been included on the agenda.

Treasurer:

The treasurer keeps an account of all the transactions, funds, donations and reimbursement of amount spent by the council. He she plays the pivotal role in setting the budget for events, dispersing amount, keeping record of bills and submitting all event reports to the faculty coordinator.

Press and media cell Incharge and Cell:

The cell takes responsibility of handling the photos and videos taken during events in the college. They also handle the social media accounts and help in promoting the college profile through the internet

Sports Incharge and Cell:

One of the most important cells working for organizing sports activities. This cell uplifts and inspires students to participate in sports.

Cultural Incharge and Cell:

The cultural cell along with the Incharge is responsible for organizing various activities like Fiesta, Ganpati Utsav, and various other activities wherein students come together and enjoy themselves beyond academics.

Co-curricular Incharge and Cell:

This cell works for academics and is involved in organizing useful and meaningful events concerned to the pharmacy field, providing career guidance, inputs about competitive exams, etc.

Communication

Regular, effective communication is the key to success for any Student Council. This doesn't happen by itself and it is a good idea to develop ways of keeping the college community informed of and involved in the various activities planned by the Student Council. Some examples include:

· Producing a student newsletter

 Providing updates to the faculty, and Principal on the Student Council's activities and plans



- Keeping a student notice-board in the college where information on the Council's activities is posted
- · Announcing upcoming events
- · Providing an end of year report to the Faculty

This communication is the responsibility of the coordinators of the specific cell. They must maintain communication with students, faculty, and the principal as well and keep all three informed about the activities.

A guide to organizing better Student Council Meetings Be prepared!

Read any information sent out before the meeting, such as the Agenda or the Minutes of the last meeting.

Prepare any points you want to raise.

Listen!

Listen carefully to what others have to say, and be open to other people's opinions. One of the purposes of meetings is to exchange ideas and information and to learn from each other.

Participate!

It is much more constructive to raise matters of concern to you at the meeting, rather than afterward.

Act!

If you undertake to follow up on a task, then do so, and be ready to report back at the next meeting,

Tips for the President:

Be prepared for each meeting and try to ensure that the other members of the group have a written agenda beforehand, if possible so that they can also be prepared for the meeting. It may be useful to meet with the

Secretary to agree to an agenda in advance of a meeting, and an agenda should include a provision for 'Any other businesses.'

Start and close each meeting punctually.

- It may be necessary to review and approve the minutes of the previous meeting at the beginning of a meeting and to sign the approved minutes.
- Present each item for discussion, ensuring that everyone who wishes to do so gets an opportunity to speak and that each person is listened to.
- Give direction to meetings making sure that it is adequate time to deal with each item on the agenda.
- Help the process of decision-making by asking people to clarify what they are saying if it is not easily understood, by summing up what someone has said, and by stating clearly the decision that is being taken before it is noted in the minutes.
- In some instances, it may be necessary to hold a vote (for example, by a show of hands,) on a particular issue.
- At the end of each meeting, make sure to arrange a date/time venue/possible agenda items for the next meeting.

Tips for the Secretary

- · Bring any correspondence received to the attention of the President before the agenda is drawn up. Perhaps some element of correspondence needs inclusion on the agenda for discussion/response.
- · If necessary read the minutes of the previous meeting at the beginning of each meeting and make any necessary corrections before the minutes are signed by the President.
- Record as accurately and as fairly as possible the minutes of each meeting.
- Remember to record attendance, excuses, apologies, and the time, date, and venue of each meeting.
- Remember also to give a brief account of correspondence received/sent since the last meeting.
- Remember that you also have a right to participate in discussions....dont allow your role to stop you from contributing to the discussion of the various matters on the
- Remember to record decisions made, who is to implement them, and when

Use the same book at each meeting for the taking of the minutes

Write up the minutes as soon as possible after each meeting

Fundraising and the Student Council

A Student Council may wish to hold fundraising events. The treasurer and concerned coordinator has responsibility for ensuring that any money raised by the Council is used for the purposes for which it was collected. A financial report should be provided to the Council at the end of the year by the coordinator.

When planning fundraising activities:

- · Be clear about why the money is needed and what will be done with it
- · Get as many ideas as possible for activities
- Make sure your planned activity will suit your college and is practical
- · Try to make sure that your event doesn't clash with another
- Make sure all students in the college are told about the event well in advance and know what the Student Council plans to use the money for some examples of fundraising activities include an art exhibition, food festival, sponsored activities, etc. Faculty should be consulted about activities planned by a Student Council, as some activities may require adult supervision.
